Habitat builds decent, affordable and energy efficient houses in partnership with those in need of adequate shelter, regardless of age, gender, national origin, religion or ethnicity.

Habitat serves families in over 70 countries and in all 50 states. Habitat for Humanity of Benton County is one of 17 affiliates in the state of Arkansas. We are currently partnering with 70 families, including 75 adults and 131 children. Over the years our affiliate has constructed over 80 homes in the county.

THE PROGRAM

Habitat for Humanity does not give away homes for free, but rather builds homes in equal partnership with families living in poverty and the community.

Future Habitat Homeowners invest at least 400 hours of "sweat equity," or manual labor, and pay off their homes with an affordable mortgage.
